

Parent Involvement Plan

Centennial staff recognizes the important role that parents play in the education of their children. Every day, we make an effort to recognize parental and familial contributions and foster relationships with parents and families.

The Parental Involvement Plan is part of our Title IA schoolwide Action Plan.

1. Centennial will hold an annual meeting to inform parents of our Title IA program at the Open House.
 - a. Parents/families are apprised of classroom procedures, expectations, and curriculum. Families are invited to meet with the Title IA staff and Learning Specialists on this evening.
 - b. Our Title IA meeting is advertised to parents in the Back to School/Open House flyer and on our website.
 - c. Childcare is offered in Room 1 or the Gym.
2. Our Student/Family/School compact is presented and signed by teachers, students, and families at the beginning of the school year or at Conferences. This compact is reviewed and updated regularly.
3. Through Open House and Parent-Teacher Conferences, parents are assisted in understanding assessments and how to monitor and work with their child to improve their child's achievement. Resources and materials are available through the Family Center, (Room 1).
 - a. Fall Conferences provide an opportunity for teachers and families to touch base, set goals, evaluate student progress toward grade level goals. It is also a time for the teacher to share strategies and ideas with parents who may be struggling to support their children in school. The Title IA Coordinator may participate in conferences for students receiving Tier 3 interventions.
 - a. During Conferences, each classroom has a sign-in sheet to determine parent/family participation at this evening event.
 4. Parents will be involved with planning, reviewing, and improving the school-wide program and the parental involvement policy through participation in the PTA. Parents will be informed of the school-wide program and the parental involvement policy through the school website and school newsletter.
 5. Parents are informed about the school performance profiles and assessment results, the curriculum used, the assessment formats and proficiency levels expected through classroom newsletters, Open House, Family Reading Night, Oregon State Assessment results on the ODE website and reported through the school district, and the school website and school newsletter.
 6. We offer a free Family Reading Night event each year. This event provides the school community with an opportunity to celebrate literacy. We also have less formal events and volunteer opportunities organized through our Family Center.
 7. These items were discussed and updated/revised as necessary by the Leadership Team (staff) and the PTA and will be annually reviewed by same each September.
