Reminders:

Smarter Balanced-

Smarter Balanced Testing will begin in April. We will be providing snacks for students during testing. If you would like to pack them a snack, please make sure it is healthy and full of protein! Here are some additional ways you can support your child during testing-

- *Make sure they get a full night of sleep*
- *Ensure they eat a healthy breakfast in the morning*
- *Be positive and supportive during testing times*

Makeup-

Makeup is not to be worn at school. If makeup is worn to school we may ask the student to wash their face. Please also make sure that makeup does not come to school in backpacks.

Warm Weather Dress-

As the weather gets warmer we tend to get questions about what students can wear to school. Below is our dress code. Please make sure your student comes to school ready to learn. If students are wearing something not appropriate we will attempt to offer clean clothes from our closet, or call a parent to bring a change of clothes.

The appearance of a student is primarily the responsibility of the student and the parents. We expect students to maintain an appearance which is not distracting to teachers or students or in any way disruptive to the instructional program. We are also concerned about clothing which can be hazardous to the health and safety of the student.

Clothing that is considered not appropriate for school includes, but is not limited to:

- *Shirts that do not cover the midriff, halter/spaghetti straps, tube tops or see-through tops.*
- *Dresses and shorts that are too short.*
- *Clothing may not advertise drugs, alcohol, violence or gangs, and may not display inappropriate language or pictures.*
- *Hats, caps and/or sunglasses will not be worn in the school building unless medically advised.*
- *The hoods of hoodies will not be worn when inside.*
- *High heels are NOT allowed.*
- *It is highly recommended, for safety reasons, that students NOT wear flip-flops or other types of slip-on sandals.*

Spring Pre-Registration Packets-

Pre-registration packets will be sent home in the next coming weeks. Students who return these packets will automatically be enrolled for the 2017-2018 school year at Page School. The packet will include non-returning student form for students who will not be returning next year. If you have a current in-district boundary waiver, you may need to fill out a new waiver for next year. Parents of kindergarten students who live outside of Page's attendance area will need to submit a boundary waiver application, which must be approved by the district before they can enroll at Page.
