Summer Letters-

We will be sending home summer letters in August. This letter will include information about the beginning of the school year. It will also include the supply list. We are changing things up for next year and it will not include teacher placement. We will post teacher placements on the windows of the front office before the first day of school. This saves us from printing additional letters if a teacher decides to move on to a different school during the summer. If you do not receive a letter it means you have not finished your registration.

Makeup- *Makeup is not to be worn at school. If makeup is worn to school we may ask the student to wash their face. Please also make sure that makeup does not come to school in backpacks.*

Warm Weather Dress-

As the weather gets warmer we tend to get questions about what students can wear to school. Below is our dress code. Please make sure your student comes to school ready to learn. If students are wearing something not appropriate we will attempt to offer clean clothes from our closet, or call a parent to bring a change of clothes.

The appearance of a student is primarily the responsibility of the student and the parents. We expect students to maintain an appearance which is not distracting to teachers or students or in any way disruptive to the instructional program. We are also concerned about clothing which can be hazardous to the health and safety of the student.

Clothing that is considered **not appropriate** for school includes, but is not limited to:

- Shirts that do not cover the midriff, halter/spaghetti straps, tube tops or see-through tops.
- Dresses and shorts that are too short.
- Clothing may not advertise drugs, alcohol, violence or gangs, and may not display inappropriate language or pictures.
- Hats, caps and/or sunglasses will not be worn in the school building unless medically advised.
- The hoods of hoodies will not be worn when inside.
- High heels are NOT allowed.
- It is highly recommended, for safety reasons, that students NOT wear flip-flops or other types of slip-on sandals.
