

Transportation for Thurston Middle School Students

According to school district guidelines, in order to be considered an eligible bus rider, an elementary student must live more than one mile from school and secondary (middle and high) students more than one-and-one-half miles from school.

If you live within the 1½ mile walking boundary for Thurston Middle – please see the attached Safe Schools walking map on the backside of this page.

If you live outside the 1½ mile boundary you are eligible for bus transportation. New students will be eligible for bus transportation on the SECOND DAY of school attendance. This means the FIRST day of new enrollment, Parent or Guardian will be responsible for the FIRST day of getting to and from school for the student. 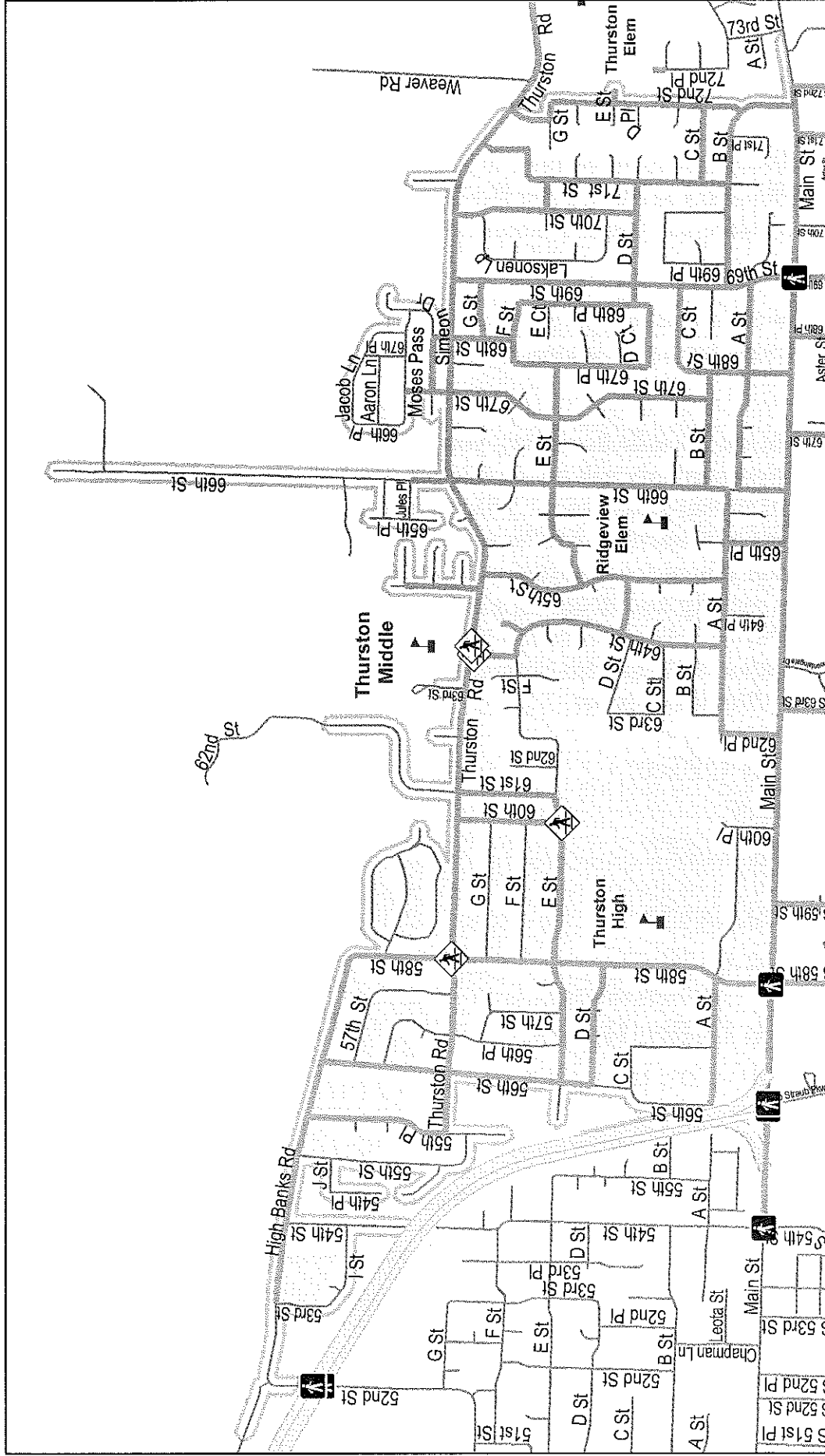
