## From Mr. Hulbert

Walterville Families:

First of all, how is it June? What a crazy-fast but wonderful year! I continue to feel blessed to work in such a caring, rich environment, surrounded by skilled professionals who put their hearts into this amazing learning environment. So much of the "amazing" comes from parents and families working hard to meet the needs of their children at home. Kids show up, for the most part, ready to learn. What a gift you are giving to their futures!

How does it pay off, you ask? Let me break it down a bit:

- **Attendance:** Kids can't learn at school if they aren't here. THANK YOU for keeping kids home when they are sick, and THANK YOU for pushing your healthy kids here as much as possible. **Our overall school attendance has been 95.6% for the year**, which is amazing!
- **Reading:** We talk about "reading risk" quite a bit when looking at reading data. Students who are "High Risk" need more help, so we put a lot of resources into filling in skill-gaps that seem to be getting in their way. We have dramatically reduced the number of "high risk readers" this year! For example, **we have ZERO high risk readers in kindergarten and 1st grade!** That is UNHEARD OF and is a reflection of the hard work done both at home (reading with your child each night *even when you are exhausted from the day!*) and at school. (Note: Not all of our data is in at this time, so this report is not comprehensive.)
  - **Parent action for the summer:** Keep reading with your kids! Listen to audiobooks as a family when going on a road trip. Interact with their about what they are reading or listening to: make predictions, talk about what the character might be feeling and why they think that is how they are feeling. Make it fun!
- **Math:** With our new *Ready/i-Ready* math curriculum, one measure of student learning growth in math is by looking at their *progress toward targeted growth*. In other words, we expect students to gain 30 points in 1st grade from fall to spring (that is their *target*). As a school, we averaged 111% of the expected targeted increase.... 11% above the expected growth for the year. Again, the data is not quite complete, so none of this is final. But the trend I am seeing is VERY exciting!

- **Parent action for the summer**: Play family games that involve math (cards, Yahtzee, cribbage, etc.). The added bonus is that many social skills can be taught while playing games: taking turns, being a good sport when winning and when losing, demonstrating teamwork, working on strategy, etc.

Thank you to everyone for a fabulous year! Happy summer! Stay safe and have a great time with your family! Next year will be here before we know it, and it promises to be even better!
